

## Introduction

This manual is for leaders at any level who desire to see disciples made, leaders raised, and churches reproduced. If you are a disciple of Jesus, you are a leader!

The intended outcome is to see the saints equipped for the work of ministry (Ephesians 4:12) in their Jerusalem, to Judea, to Samaria, to the ends of the earth (Acts 1:8)

You have a powerful purpose to do good work for God (Ephesians 2:10). This manual will help guide you. We are also here to help.

## How to Use These Activities

These activities are designed for you to use with a group of people. However, the activities may also be used for individual devotion and study.

For each activity, read the Bible verses ahead of time, so you can draw a simple picture before you meet with the group.

You should plan to meet on a regular basis. For instance, once or twice a week.

When you are with a group, help everyone to be involved. Ask others for their thoughts. Have them read the Bible aloud. Have everyone pray. Lots of sharing increases understanding for everyone!

Very important points to remember:

- 1. Make sure that each person commits to what they will DO in loving obedience to Jesus before you meet again.
- 2. When you do meet again, have everyone share about what they DID and what happened.
- 3. Challenge each other to faithfully complete what they have said they would do.

The first activities in this booklet are very detailed; later ones have very few details. The detailed activities help even brand-new believers, regardless of training or background, so they can lead. These activities serve as a model of how each meeting is conducted. Later activities are more general, since leaders will already have learned the format of meetings.

## Activity 1 - Where Are We Going? The Goal - Eternal Life



#### Welcome

- Welcome everyone and thank them for coming.
- Have everyone **repeat this prayer** after you: Thank you Jesus for loving us and having a plan for our lives. In Jesus' name, amen.
- Praise God together by reading a chapter from Psalms.
- Say: In what ways did you experience Jesus in your life this past week? In what ways did you lovingly obey him? Give time for everyone to share.



#### What to know (knowledge)

- (Optional) **Show to everyone the picture** you drew and say: Describe what you see in this picture. Give time for sharing.
- Ask someone to read aloud: Luke 10:25-28, John 14:6, John 17:3, 1 John 2:3-6. Ask one or two others to read the passages again. After reading, ask everyone to close their Bibles.
- (Optional) Show the picture to everyone again and say: Now tell how the picture describes the story we read. Give time for sharing.
- Ask everyone: What do you remember from the passage that you read? Allow everyone to share.
- Ask different persons to read the passage aloud again. Allow time for everyone to say what other things they now remember.
- Memorize: John 17:3



#### What it means (understanding)

- Ask these questions and allow time for discussion after each question.
  - What is eternal life?
  - How do we obtain eternal life?
  - What does this passage say about God, Jesus or the Holy Spirit?
  - What does this passage say about people?
  - What do you like about this passage? What do you not like about this passage?
  - What do you not understand about this passage?
- Summary: If you belong to Jesus Christ, then you share in his eternal life.

- Ask: In these passages, what is God telling you to do, in order to love and obey Jesus together?
- Ask: How will you start doing so this week? Allow time for discussion. Write answers in notebooks.
- Ask: Whom will you share this activity with this week? Allow time for discussion. Write answers in notebooks.



#### Do as a group

- Add to your list of family, neighbors and friends. Update your map.
- Say: What shall we ask Jesus to do for you? Spend time praying together for each request. Pray specifically for how each person will obey Jesus. Pray for all who have been mentioned by name.
- Ask everyone to pray to Jesus to help them to love and obey him from what they learned in this lesson. Ask for strength to share with someone about what they learned.

- Praise God together by reading a chapter from Psalms.
- Say: In what ways did you experience Jesus in your life this past week? In what ways did you lovingly obey him? Give time for everyone to share.



#### What to know (knowledge)

- (Optional) Show to everyone the picture you drew and say: Describe what you see in this picture. Give time for sharing.
- Ask someone to read aloud: Luke 10:1, Luke 9:57-62. Ask one or two others to read the passages again. After reading, ask everyone to close their Bibles.
- (Optional) Show the picture to everyone again and say: Now tell how the picture describes the story we read. Give time for sharing.
- Ask everyone: What do you remember from the passage that you read? Allow everyone to share.
- Ask different persons to read the passage aloud again. Allow time for everyone to say what other things they now remember.



#### What it means (understanding)

- Ask these questions and allow time for discussion after each question.
  - What did Jesus do before sending his disciples out to work for him?
  - What does it mean to follow Jesus?
  - What does this passage say about God, Jesus or the Holy Spirit?
  - What does this passage say about people?
  - What do you like about this passage? What do you not like about this passage?
  - What do you not understand about this passage?
- Summary: Following Jesus means that he is our top priority.

- Ask: In these passages, what is God telling you to do, in order to love and obey Jesus together?
- Ask: How will you start doing so this week? Allow time for discussion. Write answers in notebooks.

## Activity 3 – Love and Obey Jesus and Help Others to Obey




#### Welcome

- Have everyone **repeat this prayer** after you: Lord Jesus, you died for us. You have come back to life and are in heaven. We love you. Teach us to serve you with love. Teach us to obey your commands. In your name, Amen.
- Praise God together by reading a chapter from Psalms.
- Say: In what ways did you experience Jesus in your life this past week? In what ways did you lovingly obey him? Give time for everyone to share.



#### What to know (knowledge)

- (Optional) Show to everyone the picture you drew and say: Describe what you see in this picture. Give time for sharing.
- Ask someone to read aloud: Matthew 7:24-27, John 14:15. Ask one or two others to read the passages again. After reading, ask everyone to close their Bibles.
- (Optional) Show the picture to everyone again and say: Now tell how the picture describes the story we read. Give time for sharing.
- Ask everyone: What do you remember from the passage that you read? Allow everyone to share.
- Ask different persons to read the passage aloud again. Allow time for everyone to say what other things they now remember.
- Memorize: John 14:15





#### What it means (understanding)

• Ask these questions and allow time for discussion after each question.

- How can we be strong, like the believers of the Bible?
- What is a strong believer able to do?
- What does this passage say about God, Jesus or the Holy Spirit?
- What does this passage say about people?
- What do you like about this passage? What do you not like about this passage?
- What do you not understand about this passage?
- **Summary**: When we obey Jesus in love, we become stronger and can withstand troubles when they come. When we do not obey Jesus, we will not be strong and will not be able to stand when troubles come.

  - Lord's Supper

- Ask someone to read aloud: Luke 3:1–12, Mark 1:15. Ask one or two others to read the passages again. After reading, ask everyone to close their Bibles.
- (Optional) Show the picture to everyone again and say: Now tell how the picture describes the story we read. Give time for sharing.
- Ask everyone: What do you remember from the passage that you read? Allow for everyone to share.
- Ask different persons to read the passage aloud again. Allow time for everyone to say what other things they now remember.
- Memorize: Mark 1:15

#### What it means (understanding)

- Ask these questions and allow time for discussion after each question.
  - When sinners came confessing their sins, what did John do for them? What are we to do?
  - What does John say that Jesus will do when he comes?
  - What does this passage say about God, Jesus or the Holy Spirit?
  - What does this passage say about people?
  - What do you like about this passage? What do you not like about this passage?
  - What do you not understand about this passage?
- Summary: The first act of new faith is to change our beliefs about Jesus. God saves from sin and hell those who repent and believe.





- Ask everyone: What do you remember from the passage that you read? Allow for everyone to share.
- Ask different persons to read the passage aloud again. Allow time for everyone to say what other things they now remember.
- Memorize: John 3:16



#### What it means (understanding)

- Ask these questions and allow time for discussion after each question.
  - What has Jesus done so God can forgive you everything?
  - What has Jesus done so God can give you everlasting life?
  - What does this passage say about God, Jesus or the Holy Spirit?
  - What does this passage say about people?
  - What do you like about this passage? What do you not like about this passage?
  - What do you not understand about this passage?
- Summary: These are the parts of the Good News
  - $\circ\,$  Jesus died so God would forgive us our shameful acts.
  - $\circ\,$  Jesus rose from the dead so God would give us a new, eternal life.
  - To receive this from God, we must turn away from our shameful life and follow Jesus by loving and obeying him.





- Ask everyone: What do you remember from the passage that you read? Allow for everyone to share.
- Ask different persons to read the passage aloud again. Allow time for everyone to say what other things they now remember.
- Memorize: Acts 2:38



#### What it means (understanding)

- Ask these questions and allow time for discussion after each question.
  - Who gives his Holy Spirit to those who have faith in Jesus?
  - To whom does God give his Holy Spirit?
  - What does this passage say about God, Jesus or the Holy Spirit?
  - What does this passage <u>say about people</u>?
  - What do you like about this passage? What do you not like about this passage?
  - What do you not understand about this passage?
- **Summary:** God sends his Holy Spirit to dwell with those who have faith in Christ. The Holy Spirit is God himself dwelling with those who have faith in Christ

- Ask everyone: What do you remember from the passage that you read? Allow for everyone to share.
- Ask different persons to read the passage aloud again. Allow time for everyone to say what other things they now remember.
- Memorize: Matthew 28:19



#### What it means (understanding)

- Ask these questions and allow time for discussion after each question.
- What does this passage say about God, Jesus or the Holy Spirit?
- What does this passage say about people?
- What do you like about this passage? What do you not like about this passage?
- What do you not understand about this passage?
- **Summary:** Jesus commanded Christians to baptise new believers. Baptism confirms the faith of those who trust in Jesus' death and resurrection.

- Ask different persons to read the passage aloud again. Allow time for everyone to say what other things they now remember.
- Memorize: Luke 22:19-20

  - What does breaking and eating bread together remind you about?
  - What does drinking from a cup together remind you about?
  - What does this passage say about God, Jesus or the Holy Spirit?
  - What does this passage <u>say about people</u>?



## **Creating More Activities**

Look back at the activities to see the outline to use in creating new ones.

There are four main parts to creating an activity.

- 1. The passage of the Bible you want to use.
- 2. The questions you want to ask that relates to the passage.
- 3. A statement summarizing the lesson.
- 4. An activity for the group to do together.
- 5. Optionally, you may draw pictures for the activity.

Selecting the Bible passage or verses:

- Pray asking Jesus for wisdom.
- Think about what is most important for the group to learn now.
- Find a Bible story or verses that helps with this.
- Read the passage 2 3 times.
- Write the main 1 or two ideas.
- Draw the pictures (optional).
- Create the questions (see more below).
- Create a group activity.

When creating questions look at what questions can be answered by looking at the verses. Some useful questions:

- What do you remember from the passage that you read?
- What does the passage say about God, Jesus, or the Holy Spirit?
- What does the passage say about people?
- What does the passage say to me?
- Is there a..
  - Sin to confess?
  - Promise to claim?
  - Action to avoid?
  - Command to obey?
  - Example to Follow?
- What must you do, to love and obey Jesus, from this lesson? How will you implement it immediately?

REMEMBER: Loving and obeying Jesus is the most important. You must do this and help others to do so.



#### Implement General Orders for Leaders

- 1. Love and obey Jesus Christ above all else.
- 2. Know Jesus' seven general commands so thoroughly that you dream about them.
- 3. Everyone from top to bottom frequently reviews and practices the seven general commands of Jesus.
- 4. It is loving others that makes your processes, procedures, and plans succeed.
- 5. Set a few simple, concrete goals, and keep moving toward them.
- 6. When you love and obey Jesus, and help others to do the same, amazing things happen.
- 7. When persecution comes, return to the basics: love and obedience to Jesus.

#### Focus on your Vision – Jesus' Followers Enjoy Communion with God and One Another

The Lord's Supper, which is also called Communion, gives us a clear, passionate vision of what God wants us to do. We seek to bring people into communion with God and into communion with other believers. Communion with God is our vertical relationship, and communion with others is our horizontal relationship. Our vertical and horizontal relationships when put together, show the cross of Jesus Christ. It is in him and through him that these relationships become real. Christ remains central to all that we do.



Celebrate the Lord's Supper often as a reminder of what Christ has done for us and also to remember our vision of bringing others into communion with God and us.



#### How to Have the Lord's Supper (Communion)

#### Preparation:

- Have enough bread or biscuit for everyone to have a piece. It can be on a plate.
- Have a drink available in one cup. It can be juice or tea. Whatever is locally available.

#### Serving:

- **Say**: We are now going to have the Lord's Supper. Let's be quiet for some time. Pray to Jesus and ask him to forgive you of any shameful acts that come to your mind. Thank him for dying for you and coming back to life and going to heaven. Think about what he has done for you
- After some time, ask someone to say a simple prayer. For instance, "Thank you Jesus for saving us. Amen."
- Have each person pass the bread to the next person and say, "The body of Jesus, broken for us". Take a piece and hold it.
- Have each person pass the cup to the next person and say, "The blood of Jesus, spilt for us". Dip your bread a little and hold it.
- Ask someone to say a simple prayer, "Thank you Jesus for your body and your blood. Amen."
- Say: Let's eat together.
- After everyone has eaten, ask someone else to say the same prayer, "Thank you Jesus for your body and your blood. Amen."

#### **Affirm Key Practices**

If you do nothing more than love and obey Jesus and help others (followers, leaders, churches, communities) to do the same, then amazing things will happen!

#### Ask God for Wisdom

If we ask God for wisdom, he promises to give us wisdom generously without finding fault in us. However, we must believe that he will do it.

#### Love and Obey Jesus in Four Main Ways

Loving and obeying Jesus is like a diamond that has four facets:

- 1. Raising new disciples. Every disciple must make new disciples.
- 2. Training new leaders. Every leader helps train new leaders.
- 3. Starting house churches. Every church starts new churches.
- 4. Transforming communities. Churches find ways to serve their neighbors.

#### Start Christ Communities of Family and Friends

Since God has adopted us into his family, we have spiritual brothers and sisters all over the world. God wants us to work together to bring more people into His family. We do so by holding regular gatherings of his disciples.


#### Train Others to Train Others to do the Same

We believers can all obey Jesus by making disciples in several ways: by evangelizing sinners, by teaching believers to obey Jesus, and by training new church leaders and community leaders. Read Exodus 18:13-26; Matthew 28:18-20; and



Timothy 2:2. We train others in the way that Jesus and his apostles trained others. Every one of us needs to have someone who trains us while we train others in turn.

In using this manual, you should have someone who trains you – your Paul. This person helps you to make plans, practice and holds you accountable to what you will do. You should also have someone you are training – your Timothy.




#### Keep a War versus Peace Mentality and Strategy

God tells us we are in a war. He tells us that at the end times, the devil will try to give us false peace. We must truly believe this. We must always implement wartime strategies and structures.

#### Create and Update Maps

Maps are very useful to help us "see" what is happening in our areas of responsibility. Using the names of the people in your list, show where they live in relation to your home. Use a circle. If two or more in the family have become followers of Jesus, put a cross in the circle. If they have rejected Jesus, put an X through their circle. Keep expanding the names on your list and the circles on your map.





## Teach Everyone to Tell Others About Jesus

We always want to be telling others about Jesus. See Activity 7A and Activity 7B.

### Create Your Testimony (The Story of your life with Jesus)

Your story about your adventure with Jesus is very powerful and needs to be told to others. When you tell others what Jesus has done for you, it will help them want to follow Jesus, too. Here are some steps to prepare your testimony:

- Spend some time praying and asking the Lord to help you tell your story.
- Think about what your life was like before you believed in Jesus.
- Think about when you met Jesus and started following him. Who told you about him? What happened in you when you repented and believed?
- Think about what your life is like now. How has Jesus made your life different?
- Write down your testimony, telling these three parts:
  - How your life was before your believed in Jesus.
  - How you met Jesus and started following him
  - How your life is after you started following him and telling differences he makes in your life.
- You should have two versions of your story.
  - Long version that takes about 3 minutes to tell
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Short version that takes about 1 minute. to tell
- Practice telling your story until you have memorized both the long version and the short version.

#### Guide New Believers through their First Steps

For those who have just repented and believed in Jesus Christ:

- Baptize them as soon as possible. Even immediately
- Have the Lord's Supper with them.
- Teach them the 7 General Commands of Jesus
- Have them gather with their friends and family

#### Teach and Follow Three Levels of Authority

- 1. JESUS' COMMANDMENTS The Lord Jesus remains the TOP level of authority. Therefore, a church implements the commands of Jesus and his apostles from the New Testament. We must obey Jesus commandments and his apostles' instructions. The apostles' instructions arise from Jesus' commandments. As the new church in Acts chapter 2 started by obeying Jesus' basic commandments, so must new Christ communities do.
- 2. APOSTOLIC PRACTICES The SECOND level of authority in a church consists of the activities that Jesus' apostles practiced in the New Testament. The apostles did not command these practices, and we must neither require these activities nor forbid others doing them. Some examples include: baptizing immediately, using one cup in the Lord's Supper, fasting, worshiping on Sunday, speaking in tongues, and naming several elders to shepherd a church.
- 3. HUMAN TRADITIONS A LOWER level of authority in a church includes all church activities that are not described in the New Testament. A church may adopt such activities or choose not to do so. But a church should forbid such activities, when these hinder Christians obeying Jesus. And no church should require other churches to adopt its traditions. Of course, every church must adopt some traditions that help its members work together.



Some common church traditions include: non-biblical requirements for ordination, officiating the Lord's Supper, mode of baptism, church membership, Sunday School, wearing robes in the pulpit.

It is CRITICAL to make sure we are obeying (implementing) God's commands because we love Jesus. That is why we ask, "What will we do this week in loving obedience to Jesus Christ?" Then, at the next meeting, ask, "How did we love and obey Jesus?" Give opportunities for everyone to share.

#### List Names of Those Who Need to Follow Jesus

Using a piece of paper write down names of everyone you can think of. Include family, friends, co-workers, and individuals you have appointments with. This list is important to remind us who to pray for, to make time to visit them, and tell them about Jesus. Put this list somewhere you will see and remember. Below is a sample of what this list may look like.

Name	<u>Notes</u>
Samir Khan	He is suffering from cancer
Mom	She is sad since dad died
Maria Ortega	She just moved here and has no family.

Pray for these people regularly. Ask God to cause them to turn from their ways and to love and obey Jesus. Pray for needs they may have and ask God to meet those needs so they will follow him.

Teach this to your group and help them to make plans to visit each family to share about Jesus.

#### Stories about Jesus to Share with Others

Everyone likes to hear stories. Stories must prove interesting and easy for hearers to tell others, in turn. After we tell a story about the good news of Jesus, we should always to ask hearers, "Are you ready to turn away from your shameful ways and start obeying Jesus?" If they say, "yes", then you can plan to baptize them immediately. See Activity 9 on how to baptize. Then, after the baptism, start teaching them from the beginning of this book along with their friends and family. Here are some of the stories about Jesus that you can share.

- Jesus changes water into wine John 2:1-12
- Jesus heals a royal official's son John 4:46-54
- Jesus heals a paralytic at Bethesda John 5:1-18
- Jesus feeds 5000 men John 6:5-14
- Jesus walks on deep water John 6:16-24
- Jesus heals a man born blind John 9:1-41
- Jesus raises Lazarus from death John 11:1-46
- Jesus tells about Noah's ark Genesis 7 and 8



If you have pictures that illustrate the story, then show the pictures while telling the story. Hold the pictures steady, moving them so that everyone can see them. Whenever you tell a story, have someone else tell it again, asking everyone else to help him remember it. When someone else tells the story, let them also hold the pictures and show them. If there is time and they are interested, let them act out the story in a very brief skit.

#### Show Pictures or Drawings

Simple drawings can be very effective in getting people involved with God and each other. Drawings can create excitement about the lesson.



When we make drawings:

- Read the Bible passage a few times before you start drawing
- Draw a very simple picture of the main idea in the story.
- You can draw a few pictures to depict different actions from the story.
- The pictures need to be large for everyone to see.
- You can have a child draw.
- It does not need to be drawn by a professional artist. Simple drawings are best.

All the activities on this booklet can use drawings to help enhance the activity.

NOTE: When possible, have someone from the community draw the pictures, for they will do so in ways that do not offend others. Pictures should not show many details that do not help to tell the story.

#### **Key Terms**

- DISCIPLE Someone who loves and obeys Jesus and helps others to do the same.
- LEADER A disciple who helps others to love and obey Jesus.
